## RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING FEBRUARY 2020 AS BLACK HISTORY MONTH IN FORSYTH COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

WHEREAS Black History Month celebrates the achievements and contributions of African Americans and their role in shaping the state of North Carolina and the United States;

WHEREAS Dr. Carter G. Woodson, founder of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History, first launched Negro History Week in 1926, and is widely regarded as the father of Black History;

WHEREAS the quest for scholarship and achievement continues today as African Americans equipped with education and determination take leadership roles in governments, including Deputy County Manager Damon Sanders-Pratt, Assistant County Manager Shontell Robinson, Sheriff Bobby Kimbrough, Captain Debra Chenault, Register of Deeds Lynn Johnson, and Social Services Director Victor Isler;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby recognizes the month of February 2020 as Black History Month in Forsyth County, North Carolina.
